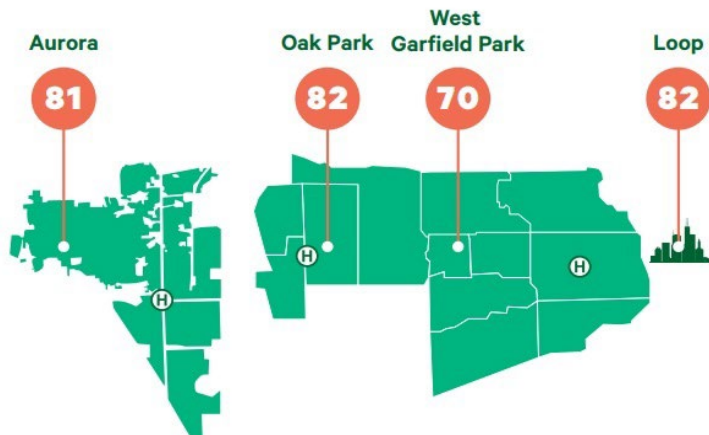

## Healthcare Anchor Network Impact Purchasing Commitment



### Core Sustainability Goals

Choose four goals from the two categories: Climate Mitigation and Environmentally Preferable Purchasing. By August 1, 2021, select at least one goal from each category; each goal will be achieved by FY2025.

#### Climate Mitigation

##### Renewable Electricity

Increasing renewable electricity procurement to one of the four levels: 25% by FY2025, 50% by FY2025, 75% by FY2025, or 100% by FY2025.

##### Transportation Emissions

When purchasing new fleet vehicles, by FY2025 at least 50% must be alternative fuel vehicles; and include criteria to become an EPA SmartWay partner for top 10 suppliers/ distributors/ carriers (by annual expenditure).

##### Anesthetic Gas:

Qualifier: Has desflurane been removed from the formulary?

If yes: Reduce GHG emissions specific to anesthetic gas by 5% from FY2020

If no: Reduce GHG emissions specific to anesthetic gas by 50% from FY2020

#### Environmentally Preferable Purchasing

##### Furniture and Furnishings

Ensure that 30 percent of the annual furnishings and furniture purchases (based on cost) eliminate the use of priority chemicals of concern by FY2025

##### PVC and DEHP

Eliminate both PVC and DEHP from at least 2 of 8 priority medical product categories (see Part III: Definitions) by FY2025.

##### Sustainable Food

Achieve 20 percent of total food purchases meeting sustainable criteria by FY2025 (measure=dollars).

Greening the OR: Reduce single-use, disposable products to reusable products  
Transition single-use, disposable products to reusable products in 5 of the 10 supply categories on the checklist (see Part III: Definitions) by FY2025. The goal is qualitative by identifying which are transitioned from disposable to reusable.



In 2022, over 600 Practice Greenhealth facilities signed onto the [HHS pledge](#) and publicly committed to "develop and release a climate resilience plan for continuous operations by the end of 2023, anticipating the needs of groups in their community that experience a disproportionate risk of climate-related harm." Drawing from Health Care Without Harm's resilience framework of "facilities, community, and public infrastructure," this cohort provides guidance and a structured approach for drafting climate resilience plans for health systems that have signed onto the HHS Pledge.

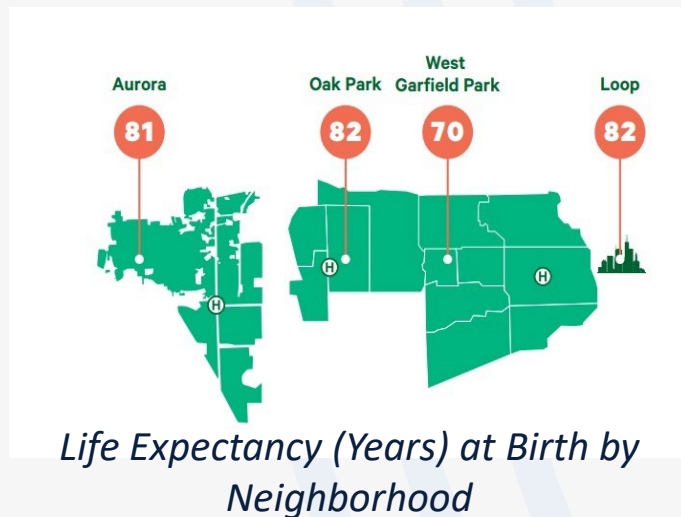

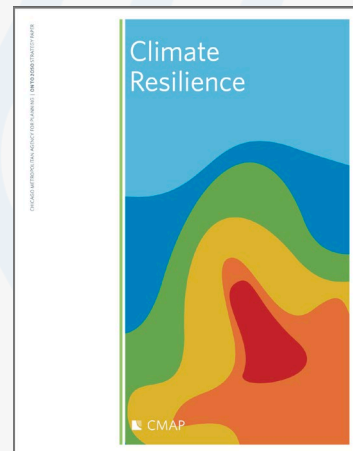
